Background:

This one day workshop is organised by the National Cancer Research Institute's Cancer Experience Collaborative (CECo). It is aimed at hospice staff and managers as well as health care professionals in other sectors, educators, academics, students and anyone who is new to or just beginning in palliative care research but is keen to learn more and develop their research knowledge and skills.

The main aims of the day are to:

- Develop an understanding of research and its relevance to hospice and palliative care
- Identify researchable questions
- Explore ethical issues in the conduct of research in hospice and palliative care
- Explore different research methods which can be used in hospice and palliative care research

The workshop will provide plenty of opportunities for interaction, networking and discussion. Key topics include:

- The nature of research and its relevance to hospice and palliative care
- The difference between research, audit and evaluation
- Ethical issues in palliative care research
- Research governance issues
- Researchable and non-researchable questions
- Approaches to research in hospice and palliative care

This event is part of CECo's programme of research capacity building events. CECo is one of two groups (together with COMPASS Collaborative) to be awarded funding by the National Cancer Research Institute (NCRI) to improve research in palliative and supportive care in the UK. CECo is a joint enterprise between five Universities (Lancaster, Liverpool, Manchester, Nottingham and Southampton), clinical organisations (including the four largest hospices in England and Help the Hospices), and members of the user community.
